

Atrium Windows and Doors – North Texas manufactures exterior windows and patio doors that, when purchased with a specific “tax credit low-e glass with argon gas fill,” meet or exceed the thermal performance requirements outlined in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, in accordance with Internal Revenue Notice 2006-26.


The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 allows for a tax credit of 30% of the purchase price, up to a maximum of \$1,500 for the two-year period, for home improvement products installed in 2009 and 2010.

The products listed below, when ordered with the “tax credit low-e/argon” glass option, will achieve a U-factor of .30 or lower, and a Solar Heat Gain Coefficient (SHGC) of .30 or lower. The actual performance numbers for these products are reflected on each unit’s NFRC label, and the specific numbers may vary by series, style and other glass options.
