A Shot of Sunscreen

Many folks at McCoy's spend a lot of time outdoors whether they're working in the lumberyard, completing projects are home, or just spending time on the water on their days off. If you know you'll be spending any amount of time outdoors, it's important to always wear sunscreen. The sun emits harmful UV rays year-round, even on cloudy days, so you don't want to skip the sunscreen just because the sun isn't out.

Using sunscreen helps protect your skin from sunburn, early skin aging, and skin cancer. The American Academy of Dermatology recommends everyone use a water-resistant, broad-spectrum sunscreen in a SPF 30 or higher and buying a new bottle of sunscreen every year. Most adults need about 1 ounce of sunscreen — or enough to fill a shot glass — to fully cover their body including their feet, neck, ears, and the top of their head. SPF lip balm can also be applied to protect lips from sunburn.

However, sunscreen alone can't fully protect a person. In addition to wearing sunscreen, dermatologists recommend taking the following steps to protect your skin and find skin cancer early:

- Seek shade when appropriate, remembering that the sun's rays are strongest between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Wear protective clothing, such as a lightweight long-sleeved shirt, pants, a wide-brimmed hat, and sunglasses when possible.
- Use extra caution near water and sand. They reflect the damaging rays of the sun, which can increase your chance of sunburn.
- Get vitamin D safely through a healthy diet.
- Avoid tanning beds. Ultraviolet light from the sun and tanning beds can cause skin cancer and wrinkling.
- Check your skin. If you notice anything changing, itching, or bleeding on your skin, see a board-certified dermatologist. Skin cancer is highly treatable when caught early.
